# Communities overburdened and highly impacted by criteria air pollution





### **Criteria Air Pollutants**

- Carbon monoxide (CO)
- Lead (Pb)
- Nitrogen dioxide (NO<sub>2</sub>)
- Sulfur dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>)
- Ozone (O<sub>3</sub>)
- Particle or particulate matter (PM)

#### Common "criteria" air pollutants



#### **Particle Pollution**

Tiny solids or liquid drops floating in the air.

#### Sources:

- · Wood stoves and fireplaces
- Outdoor burning
- Dust from construction and agriculture
- Wildfires



#### **Ground-level Ozone**

Contributes to smog. Forms when some air pollutants react with each other in sunlight and hot weather.

#### Sources:

- Cars
- Industry



#### **Carbon Monoxide**

Odorless, tasteless, colorless gas from combustion.

#### Sources:

- Cars
- · Wood stoves and fireplaces
- Outdoor burning
- · Industrial combustion



#### **Sulfur Dioxide**

Forms when fuel that contains sulfur is burned.

#### Sources:

- Industrial facilities (like fossil fuel power plants, pulp mills)
- Ships and locomotives



#### **Nitrogen Dioxide**

Produced when fuel burns. Highest levels are near roads.

#### Sources:

- Cars
- · Ships and locomotives
- · Industrial power plants



#### Lead

Lead was an air quality problem. Today, all of Washington meets the air quality standard for lead.

#### Source:

 Metal and ore processing facilities



# Goals of the Grant Program



Engage people in overburdened communities to design local projects to improve air quality




Reduce air pollution and protect public health



## **Community Engagement**

- Conducted community engagement to inform design of the grant program
- Hosted virtual listening sessions with Tribes and the public in May and June 2024 alongside an online comment period
  - Also met with 21 organizations

## Projects for Communities, by Communities

- Engaged with overburdened communities to inform grant design
- Each community can submit different project types to address local concerns
- Grantees are required to engage with the community in the design of projects
  - Community engagement is an eligible cost
- Scoring criteria includes points for community engagement experience
- Intend to offer an award in each community





## **Funding Available**

### **Total funding**

- \$10 million is available for eligible projects in communities overburdened and highly impacted by criteria air pollution and participating Tribes
- No match requirements

#### Individual award maximum

- Up to \$700,000 project
- Ecology may offer a lower or higher award depending on interest in the program

## **Timeline**

- Application period opened on August 29, 2024 and closes on October 24, 2024 at 5 p.m. PDT
- Anticipate making awards by early winter
- Grant project period is through June 30, 2025
  - Expect to extend the project period for up to two years, dependent upon Ecology receiving approval to do so



## **Eligible Projects**



Planning and community engagement to develop projects that will reduce criteria air pollution.



Implementation for projects to reduce criteria air pollution. These projects must have already completed a community engagement process.

Projects must be serving one of the identified communities or participating Tribe.

# Planning and Community Engagement Project Examples



- To reduce criteria air pollution emissions:
  - Partner with local community residents to identify priority projects.
  - Design and plan strategies and projects.
  - Improve communication efforts among community groups to address sources of criteria air pollution emissions





## Air Pollution Reduction Project Examples

- Support free yard waste collection
- Replace old residential wood stoves with cleaner home heating options
- Incentivize agricultural dust reduction
- Reduce vehicle miles traveled
- Certain zero emission transportation projects (only eligible for planning and design)



## **Secondary Eligible Projects**

- Focus of the grant is reducing sources of outdoor air pollution
- The following activities are eligible, but must be a part of emissions reduction project and be identified as a need by the community.
  - Distribution of portable air cleaners to vulnerable populations
  - Planting trees
- Applicants can spend no more than 15% of total award on these activities.

## Eligible Applicants

Including, but not limited to:

- Local municipalities
- Community based organizations
  - Requires nonprofit status in Washington
- Tribes<sup>1</sup> and entities serving them

See our grant guidelines for the full list. Applicants must be located in and registered to operate legally in Washington, which includes having a Washington State Unified Business Identifier (UBI) number



## **Tribal Eligibility**

- Tribes participating in Ecology's initiative to improve air quality in overburdened communities highly impacted by air pollution
  - Entities serving these Tribes

## **Eligible Costs**

- Administrative costs
- Community engagement & outreach
  - Community compensation
- Costs associated with project planning and design
- Equipment purchases
- Indirect costs
- Travel costs

## **Ineligible Costs**

- Construction or general maintenance of buildings and parking facilities
- Entertainment
- Fines and penalties
- Certain legal expenses
- New paving and landscaping beyond the project's scope of work

- Existing operating costs outside of the project's scope of work
- Purchase or rental of real estate
- Research and development
- Costs related to ineligible projects
- All costs incurred before the effective date of a signed grant agreement

## **Application Requirements**

- General project information (EAGL online forms)
- Screening questions (not scored)
  - Determines eligibility and whether the application will be scored
- Evaluation questions (scored)
  - Includes a description of the project, including tasks, deliverables, and timeline
- Budget proposal (required, not scored)
  - Template provided



## Scoring

Applicants will submit narrative answers to 9 questions, which fall into five categories. There are word limits on answers.

Category	Total Points Possible
Project Narrative	8
Organizational Profile	26
Environmental Justice	26
Community Engagement	30
Community Letters of Support	10
Total	100

## **Award Selection**

- Responses will be evaluated by a committee with experience in air quality, environmental justice, and community engagement
- Will offer highest scoring application in each of the communities
- If funding remains, will repeat the process above.

## Other Application Requirements

- Collaborative applications encouraged
  - One organization must apply on behalf of the partnership and will be responsible for all grant deliverables and requirements.
- Must submit separate applications for each project location
- Applicants may support more than two projects, but may only be the lead on up to two applications.

## **Application Information**

- Apply online through Ecology's Administration of Grants and Loans (EAGL) platform
  - System only allows one application per organization. If applying for more than one project, contact AQcommunitygrants@ecy.wa.gov

## Recipient Grant Management Requirements

- Accept award within 45 days
- Agreement development
  - All costs incurred prior to the effective date of a signed grant agreement are not eligible for reimbursement
- Applicants will submit reimbursement requests for costs incurred
- Submit a cultural resources review form
- Submit quarterly progress reports and equipment purchase reports
- Project closeout report

# **Ecology's Administration of Grants & Loans (EAGL)**





## **EAGL**

- Full grant applications must be submitted through EAGL.
- Applicants are required to have Secure Access Washington (SAW) and EAGL accounts.
- EAGL can only be accessed through SAW.
- Applications, funded grant agreements, scope of work deliverables, and payment requests/progress reports are managed in EAGL.



# Registering for SAW and EAGL

#### Applying for or managing a grant or loan

You can apply for and manage most grants and loans in EAGL, Ecology's Administration of Grants and Loans system. To use EAGL, you must:

- 1. Have a Secure Access Washington (SAW) account
- 2. Register as an EAGL user
