Mitigated Determination of NonSignificance

**Description of Proposal:**

Lane Mountain Company (LMC) plans to add a new screening operation to produce a new product called "brown sand". This product will combine LMC processed sand and importing additional sand and utilizing existing equipment to blend the two into a new product. This blending process will be incorporated into their Fugitive Dust Control Plan (FDCP). The proposed install will occur within the existing property boundaries. LMC also plans to install a single new Baghouse (dust collection system) for greater control efficiency of particulate matter. The new Baghouse is in addition to the existing control equipment and is designed to further reduce air emissions.
