Model Toxics Control Act Cleanup Rule

- Governs investigation & cleanup of contaminated sites
- Last significant update in 2001
- Focus on updating & clarifying cleanup process
- Many updates, for most parts of the rule except the cleanup standards













- Exploratory Rulemaking (2018)
- First Rulemaking
 - Development (2019-2023)
 - Stakeholder and Tribal Advisory Group
 - Preliminary drafts
 - Proposal (2023)
 - Proposed rule amendments
 - Public comment and hearings
 - Adoption (August 2023)
 - Effective (2024)

Identify sites likely to impact vulnerable populations or overburdened communities

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Prioritize sites when allocating resources

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Develop strategic plans

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Assess progress







Theme 1 Environmental Justice: Site-level decisions



- Investigate threats to
 impacted communities
- Develop & evaluate alternatives through an EJ lens
- Document evaluations
- Seek participation (if formal site)









Theme 2 **Public Participation** & Notice

- Adds new methods
- Updates:
 - Use of Site Register
 - o "Public notice" for formal sites
- Clarifies methods for independent sites

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Theme 3 Site Hazard Assessment & Ranking Process

- Removes WARM from the rule
- Requires new procedure by the "SHARP Tool"
 - ✓ Enables us to rank all sites
 - ✓ Uses current available information
 - ✓ Reports confidence
 - ✓ Allows updates to rankings
- Supports site listing, cleanup decisions, & public information
- Informs program-level planning prioritization & evaluation















Theme 4 Program Planning & Prioritization



Comprehensive, integrated strategic planning based on SHARP

- Resource allocation based on legislative priorities
 - > Human health & environment
 - Environmental Justice
 - Land reuse





- Periodic program evaluation and adjustment
- Public access and notice









• Clearer, step-wise procedures



Theme 5– Site-Level Decisions

Remedial investigations Emphasized potential EJ impacts

Added cultural resource protection

 Moved approved sampling & analysis methods outside rule





Theme 5 – Site Level Decisions Cleanup action requirements and feasibility studies



• Clearer, step-wise procedures



- Emphasis on climate resilience
- Clarified and separated consideration of public concerns & tribal interests



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Increased EJ accountability & transparency

Required separate
 reporting of investigations

 Changed how we notify the public

Improve initial response

Streamline actions & reporting Update characterization requirements

Require periodic status reports
