Consistent with RCW 90.58.030(2)(e) and (f) and WAC 173-22 and WAC 173-26-201(2)(a) Fry Creek is within shoreline jurisdiction because it is within the Ordinary High Water Mark of Grays Harbor Estuary. It does not independently meet the criteria to be a shoreline waterbody. Revisions clarify this.
