01	2.7	Historical/Cultural Resources	An element related to the protection and restoration of buildings, <u>structures, sites, districts, objects</u> and areas <u>landscapes</u> having archaeological, historic, cultural, scientific or educational values within the shorelines of the City of Everson.	These changes are recommended by the City of Everson based on comments received during Ecology’s public comment period from the Washington Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation (DAHP).
02	Policy 2.7C	Historical/Cultural Resources	Protection and rehabilitation of significant archaeological, historic, and cultural sites should be encouraged and, where appropriate, should <u>shall</u> be required.	
03	6.1	Archaeological Areas and Historic Sites	Native American and pioneer villages, military forts, old settlers homes, and trails were often located on <u>Significant archaeological, cultural, and historic resources can include sites, districts, buildings, structures, objects, and landscapes that provide economic benefits and provide us with information about the past that continues to shape our community. These resources can be found anywhere but particularly along shorelines because of the proximity of food resources and because water provided a practical means of transportation. These sites are nonrenewable because water provided a practical means of transportation. These sites are nonrenewable resources and many are in danger of being lost through present day changes in land use and urbanization. Because of their rarity and the educational link they provide to our past, these locations should be preserved whenever possible.</u>

06	16.04.030	Definitions	<u>ARCHAEOLOGICAL RESOURCE/SITE – Means a geographic locality in Washington, including but not limited to, submerged and submersible lands and the bed of the sea within the state’s jurisdiction, that contains archaeological objects.</u>	
07	16.04.030	Definitions	<u>HISTORIC SITE – Means those sites that are eligible or listed on the Washington Heritage Register, National Register of Historic Places or any locally developed historic registry.</u>
