Dear Fire Service Professional,

On October 15, 2024, the Washington State Department of Ecology (we) released the Final Environmental Impact Statement regarding the disposal of PFAS-containing firefighting foam. You can access this document on our webpage at ecology.wa.gov/afff-eis.

Ecology selected Alternative 2, incineration, as the preferred disposal option for our aqueous film-forming foam (AFFF) collection and disposal program. The program is now open to [qualifying departments](#).¹

To participate in the disposal program, please complete the following steps:

- Complete the participation agreement provided below and return it to Ecology. See page 2 of the agreement for how to submit your signed form.
- Fill out the [new AFFF foam stockpile survey](#) online.²
- Please complete Ecology's [Notification of Dangerous Waste Site Identification \(ID\) Form](#).³ Call the Dangerous Waste Annual Reporting line at 1-800-874-2022 or email us at turbowaste@ecy.wa.gov for assistance with the forms.

We will review the submitted materials for completeness. Should we have any questions regarding your application, we will contact you directly.

If we approve your application, we will contact you to authorize and schedule AFFF pick-up with our third-party contractor.

Please note that the AFFF disposal program is dependent on available funding and is scheduled to conclude on June 30, 2025. Your department's paperwork must be submitted and approved by us before your foam collection can begin. To ensure your department's participation in the program, please submit the required paperwork listed above before April 30, 2025.

Aqueous Film-Forming Foam Collection and Disposal Program Participation Agreement



(Participant) and Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) agree to the following terms and conditions for participation in Ecology's Aqueous Film-Forming Foam (AFFF) Collection and Disposal Program.

Background

Ecology is authorized by the Legislature to implement a voluntary disposal program of qualifying PFAS-containing firefighting foam possessed by participating fire departments and state agencies (Participants).

Ecology is working to hire a licensed hazardous waste hauler to collect and transport the qualifying firefighting foam to a hazardous waste treatment, storage, and disposal facility. The hazardous waste hauler will conduct the collection, transport, and final disposal of the AFFF described in this agreement on behalf of the participant.

Ecology will cover only the costs for qualifying participants associated with the collection, transport, and disposal of qualifying foam. Ecology will not cover the costs associated with decontaminating AFFF-contaminated equipment. This program will not cover costs associated with the disposal of non-qualifying foam or other hazardous waste.

While the hazardous waste hauler will conduct the actual foam disposal, participants in the program will remain the "generators" of the foam under Washington's dangerous waste regulations (see WAC 173-303-040). Participation in this program is voluntary. Ecology will not at any time assume the generator's responsibilities under Chapter 173-303 WAC.

Terms of Participation

The participant agrees to:

1. Sign and return this participation agreement to Ecology (see next page).
2. Submit current information through the new [AFFF foam stockpile survey](https://forms.office.com/g/jLFmjmKFAX) on the location, amount, and containerization of the foam (<https://forms.office.com/g/jLFmjmKFAX>).
3. Provide a point of contact within your organization who can answer questions about the foam stockpiles in a timely manner and coordinate with the contracted hazardous waste transporter. Update this point of contact as necessary.
4. Comply with all dangerous waste regulations. Compliance requires, but is not limited to, the completion of required hazardous waste paperwork, including manifests, notification of dangerous waste site identification forms, and annual reports.

As funding allows, and prior to the termination of the program, Ecology will pay for:

- Collection of qualifying foam from participant's premises.
- Transportation to and disposal at an authorized facility.

The program is scheduled to terminate on June 30, 2025.

Participants agree to allow Ecology or our authorized third party, if necessary, to sample foam stockpiles to determine their PFAS concentrations and chemical characteristics.

Participants also agree to indemnify, defend, save and hold harmless the state of Washington, its employees, and agents from any and all claims or causes of action for death or injuries to person or for loss or damage to property arising from or on account of acts or omissions of participant, its officers, employees, or agents in entering into this agreement or that may occur in the course of Ecology, its employees, or agents carrying out the terms of this agreement.

If Ecology is unable to secure a contract with a hazardous waste hauler, this agreement will automatically terminate. Further, either the participant or Ecology may terminate this agreement upon thirty days written notice to the other party. At the end of the thirty days, this agreement will be terminated. This agreement shall terminate automatically upon enactment of any law or regulation which renders the contents illegal or prohibits any obligations entered into within.
