Background

- In 2021, the Governor signed RCW 70A.60 (Hydrofluorocarbons – Emissions Reduction) into law.
 - This law will help Washington to achieve the state's overall goal of reducing Greenhouse Gas emissions to net zero by 2050.
- In 2023, Ecology adopted a rule supporting the transition away from using certain potent greenhouse gases known as hydrofluorocarbons (or HFCs) in products and equipment.



Rulemaking context

Amendments to Chapter 173-443 WAC

Establishes:

- Requirements for the transition to more climate-friendly refrigerants and refrigerant substitutes in air conditioning and refrigeration, aerosol propellants, and foam in Washington.
- A refrigerant management program to address refrigerants leaking from existing large equipment in Washington.

• Ecology is considering:

- Revisions to WAC 173-443-065 & -075 to modify the sell-through provision that allows equipment manufactured prior to prohibition dates to be sold for a limited amount of time
- Revisions to WAC 173-443-040 to modify the prohibitions for Automatic Commercial Ice Machines (ACIMs)
- Other necessary technical and administrative changes throughout the chapter.



Rulemaking Objectives

• This rulemaking will:

- Support the transition away from using certain potent greenhouse gases known as hydrofluorocarbons (HFCs) in products and equipment.
- Improve implementation of the statute.



Revisions: Sell-through provision

- WAC 173-443-065 & -075 Prohibitions and additional requirements for new or retrofit refrigeration & air conditioning equipment listed in Table 2 and Table 3.
 - (2) Sell through provision. Refrigeration/Air conditioning equipment that is manufactured prior to January 1, 2024, may be sold, leased, rented, installed, or otherwise introduced into Washington commerce until January 1, 2026.
- Rental equipment not included in any other sell through provision
- Specific dates in provision prior to some restriction dates in Tables 2 and 3



Revisions: Automatic commercial ice machines

- Ecology has elected to refrain from enforcement of the January 1, 2025, effective date in WAC 173-443-040, Table 1
- ACIM manufacturers must comply with EPA's Technology Transitions rule in 40 CFR 84.54(a)(i)-(ii) and (c)(14), as published on October 24, 2023 (88 FR 73205)
- Ecology will update the rule to reflect the EPA requirements
- Ecology will issue guidance by the end of 2024



Revisions: Technical and administrative

- Including, but not limited to:
 - Clarifying language
 - Changing program titles
 - Air Quality Program to Climate Pollution Reduction Program
 - Fixing typos


