




Purpose and Overview

- There are 4 parts of this rulemaking: A through D of WAC 173-925
- Ecology has shared draft language for parts A C
- Input will be accepted until November 1, 2022
- SmartComment is open for input on revised draft A C
- Input should include needs for clarity and suggested language revisions
- Ecology will consider all input as revisions continue



Part A – General and Definitions

- New or altered definitions for:
 - Beverage
 - Producers
 - De minimis producers
 - Household Cleaning Products
 - Personal care products
 - Federal regulations
 - Third party representative

Entity



New draft definition proposed since most recent draft:

(10) "Entity" means an individual and any form of business enterprise. For purposes of calculating the de minimis producer thresholds in subsection (6), a producer entity includes all legal entities that are affiliated by common ownership of fifty percent or greater, including parents, subsidiaries, and commonly owned affiliates.

Producers



- New draft definition proposed since most recent draft:
 - (23)(a) "Producer" means the entity responsible for compliance with the requirements of this chapter for a covered product sold, offered for sale, or distributed in or into this state.
 - (b) The producer of a covered product is the entity that affixes its brand, or specifies that its brand be affixed, to the covered product container or retail packaging, unless one of the following is true:
 - (c) If an entity is a "brand licensor," meaning it has licensed its brand to be used on a covered product that is to be sold by the licensee, then the licensee is the producer.
 - (d) If the covered product lacks identification of a brand, the producer is the entity that specified the material specifications for the covered product
 - (e) If there is no person described in (b), (c), or (d) of this subsection that has undertaken distribution of the product in or into this state, then the producer is the entity who imports or distributes the covered product in or into the state, including through online sales.

^{*(}f) contains the original language from the RCW

De minimis producers



- New draft definition proposed since most recent draft:
 - (6) (a) "De minimis producer" means an entity that annually sells, offers for sale, distributes, or imports in or into the country for sale in Washington:
 - (i) Less than one ton of a single category of plastic beverage containers, plastic household cleaning and personal care containers, or plastic trash bags each year; or
 - (ii) A single category of a covered product that in aggregate generates less than \$1,000,000 each year in revenue from sales into Washington.
 - (b) These thresholds are to be calculated at the level of the producer "entity" as defined in subsection (10). De minimis does not apply to entities who have agreed to accept responsibility on the behalf of a producer.
 - (c) De minimis producers are not required to meet annual registration, reporting, PCR, or fee requirements, but must annually notify the department in writing to demonstrate that they meet the de minimis threshold.
 - (d) The department may request additional information to verify the de minimis status of a producer, including:
 - (A) Annual revenue dollar amount less than or equal to one million dollars;
 - (B) Annual total resin weight less than or equal to one ton; and
 - (C) Any additional information requested by the Department

Requests for Confidentiality



- 70A.245.090(2) and 70A.245.030
- Ecology must annually publish <u>a list</u> of the following:
 - Registered producers of covered products
 - Associated brand names of registered producers
 - Compliance status
 - Specific items the producer requests to keep confidential
- Producers may annually submit confidentiality requests
- Requests must be granted by Director of the agency
 - Outlined in <u>RCW 43.21A.160</u>
- Factors for Ecology's determination:
 - Is granting confidentiality detrimental to public interest?
 - Does the request relate to unique processes of production?
 - Would producer's competitive position be compromised?




Part C - PCR Content Requirements

- Average PCR content weight by resin type by product category
- Total PCR resin as percentage of total weight
- If providing national or regional data:
 - Method for calculating/separating WA specific data
 - Explanation for why state-level data cannot be obtained



Part D - Enforcement

- Audits of information
- Process for non-compliance
- Penalties
 - Calculation of penalty amount
 - Penalty deadlines
 - Adjustments to penalties
 - Corrective action plans





Fee Calculation and Draft Rule Language

WAC 173-925 Part B – Section 050 Producer annual fee calculation and payment.

Changes to Rule Language

- Streamlines language regarding workload analysis
- Adds option for other criteria to be used for equitable fee distribution
- Simplifies equations to focus on fee calculations
- Provides basis for adjustments to billings based on previous costs and revenue
- Clarifies the basis for fee calculations: total plastic resins (PCR and virgin)



Administrative Requirements

- Due within 60 days of invoice mailing
- Late notice, 30 days to resolve
- Failure to pay fees may result in enforcement actions, including penalty





Equation 1(a), Program Administration Fee

Program Admin Fee = Ecology Program Admin Cost x [(Individual Producer Resin)/(Washington Resin Total)]

Program Admin Fee = $$603,144 \times [(Individual Producer Resin)/(300,097,832.51 lbs)]$

Equation 1(b), PCR Content Oversight Fee

PCR Oversight Fee = Ecology PCR Content Oversight Cost x

[(Individual Producer Resins, Reporting Categories)/

(Washington Resin Total, Reporting Categories)]

<u>Individual Producer Resins, Reporting Categories</u> = One registered and reporting producer's total pounds of all plastic resins (PCR and virgin) used in all categories of covered products that are required to meet PCR content minimum requirements sold or offered for sale in Washington State for the prior calendar year.

<u>Washington Resin Total, Reporting Categories</u> = total pounds of all plastic resins (PCR and virgin) used in all categories of covered products that are required to meet PCR content minimum requirements sold or offered for sale in Washington State for the prior calendar year.
