State Environmental Policy Act Determination of NonSignificance

Description of Proposal: Ecology is proposing to revise the existing Ecology General Order for rock crushers. The intent of General Orders is to provide a streamlined permitting process for applicants who qualify and can satisfy the limits within the General Order. Ecology has had a rock crusher General Order since December 6, 2006. Ecology revised this General Order in February 7, 2007 and December 6, 2011. Ecology is proposing to revise it again as allowed in WAC 173-400-560 (General Order of approval). The rock crushing process occurs in a gravel pit and includes crushing, screening, conveying, and loading and is described in EPA document EPA AP-42 11.19.2 air emission factor sources for "Crushed Stone Processing". Bucket loaders within the pit bring the preprocessed rocks to the crusher. After crushing, the rocks may be crushed further, screened, and eventually transported from the site. The revisions proposed for the General Order include: limits on annual and daily production of air pollution producing materials; requirements to limit air pollution; and requirements to keep air pollution equipment at certain distances from the property boundary and from any residence, occupied commercial building, school, hospital, nursing home or other sensitive receptor.

Applicant: Same as Lead Agency

Location of Proposal: The revision of this General Order is limited to an Ecology action of making the General Order available as an option. But it is not known when or if a facility will apply to use the revised General Order. Therefore there is no specific property or site to evaluate at this time. However, the revised General Order for rock crushers will be available for use by applicants in the following counties regulated by Ecology's Air Quality Program (Adams, Asotin, Chelan, Columbia, Douglas, Ferry, Franklin, Garfield, Grant, Kittitas, Klickitat, Lincoln, Okanogan, Pend Oreille, Stevens, Walla Walla, and Whitman) or any other source regulated by Ecology]

Ecology has determined that it does not have a probable significant adverse impact on the environment. An environmental impact statement is not required under RCW [43.21C.030\(2\)\(c\)](#). This decision was made after review of a completed environmental checklist and other information on file with the lead agency.
