Background

- In 2021, RCW 70A.60 (Hydrofluorocarbons – Emissions Reduction) was signed into law.
- In 2023, Ecology adopted a rule to address these super pollutants in Washington.
- In 2024, Ecology announced the Hydrofluorocarbons and Other
 Fluorinated Greenhouse Gases rule to amend Chapter 173-443 WAC.





Hydrofluorocarbons (HFCs)

- Ozone friendly replacement to chlorofluorocarbons and other ozone depleting substances
- High Global Warming Potential (GWP); up to 15,000 times more impactful than carbon dioxide

Addressing these short-lived "super pollutants" will make a significant and immediate impact on climate.





















HFCs are all around

Why HFCs matter

- HFCs are the fastest-growing greenhouse gas in the world because of increasing global demand for cooling and refrigeration.
 - State, federal, and international laws and treaties are phasing down production of certain HFCs and shifting to alternatives.
- HFCs account for more than four million metric tons of carbon equivalent emissions in Washington each year.
- Reducing HFC emissions helps Washington state meet its climate goals.





Cutting costs & climate impact

- Refrigerants are expensive and getting more expensive with time.
- Leaking equipment is less efficient.
- Refrigerants are potent greenhouse gases that contribute to climate change.
- Preventing and stopping leaks quickly is good for bottom lines and for the environment.

What our rule does

- Restricts High Global Warming Potential (GWP) HFCs in certain products
- Creates GWP thresholds on new equipment
- Establishes a refrigerant management program for existing equipment





Rulemaking context

Ecology is proposing:

- Revisions to WAC 173-443-065 & -075 to modify the sell-through provision
- Revisions to WAC 173-443-040
 - To align the list of prohibited substances and effective dates for Automatic Commercial Ice Machines with EPA's Technology Transitions rule
 - Other necessary technical and administrative changes



 By restricting the use of the most potent HFCs in new equipment and properly maintaining equipment that contain those HFCs, Washington will prevent roughly four million metric tons of greenhouse gas emissions each year by 2035.

Key Objectives

• Ecology has identified parts of the rule that could be amended to improve clarity, facilitate more consistent implementation, and reduce unintended consequences from the current rule.

Interpretative Statements

- December 2024
 - Guidance for ACIMs
- February 2025
 - HFC restrictions in data center cooling equipment.
- April 2025
 - HFC sell-through provisions



Key Clarifications

- Refrigerant restrictions
 - Existing equipment does not need to be replaced
 - Restrictions apply only to equipment manufactured after the restriction dates

Rulemaking scope

• This rulemaking can only address topics that fall within its defined scope. Topics outside of this scope may be considered in a future rulemaking.

Environmental Justice Assessment

 - Increase awareness about Hydrofluorocarbons
 - Gather feedback from Tribes, environmental justice organizations and other members of the public who may have insight into the impacts of this rulemaking on Washington's communities.
 - Encourage public participation in the rulemaking process.
